| Action item #1 | We have increased our SAC time from 0.65 to 1.0 FTE from the Vera Budget to address the needs of students. She is able to provide universal strategies and support for students. She provides an avenue for students who are struggling emotionally to ensure they are able to learn. | |
| Action Item #2 | We have added a grade level assembly per month led by the Student Advocacy Counsellor to address virtues and mental health initiatives. We continue to have Whole school assemblies focusing on PBIS monthly. | |
| Action Item #3 | Promote our SFSK support in the kindergarten and grade one classrooms more intentionally so that they are aware that they have this type of support at school. We are directing our Student Advocacy Counselor (SAC)AC to visit each Early Childhood S (ECS) and Grade 1 classroom at least once a week to increase familiarity and awareness. | |

| Action item #4 | Increase universal support through our Student Advocacy Counsellor (SAC) and Successful Families Successful Kids (SFSK) to address high levels of nervousness, anxiety and feeling on edge in our grade two and three classrooms. |

| Action Item #5 | We have added a regular staff meeting agenda item to remind staff of the two areas of concern and how they can address it in class. This will include reinforcement of DPA and Mental Health Bin activities. |
| Action Item #6 | Fish Activity focusing on <u>Developmental Relationships</u> to be addressed at March PD. This activity identifies students who may be at risk of falling through the cracks. |

Strategies

Universal Strategies: to support all our students' mental health:

- Host a joint School Council meeting between Vera and Aurora to discuss the transition process between the school in March 2025.
- Aurora amin and staff regular classroom visits to grade 3 classes
- 1.0 FTE SAC: This increase was to support the early mental health needs that are evident as the foundation of mental wellness and ensuring students are supported mentally to allow optimal learning.
- Schoolwide assemblies focusing on PBIS
- Grade Level Assemblies with themes of Virtues
- Turtle Tokens and monthly celebrations to support appropriate, expected behaviors
- SFSK classroom sessions, in conjunction with SAC
- Apple Schools <u>Action Plan</u>
- Intentional transitions with Aurora
 - o Visits to Growing Dome
 - o Aurora Admin to lead school wide assemblies
 - o Aurora staff (all levels) classroom visits to Vera & anecdotal notes/conversations ongoing throughout the year
 - Bread Tea and Story Day: Multicultural Transition Day in which we highlight many cultures represented in our community.
 - Example sessions include:
 - Random Acts of Kindness
 - Kimochi feelings program
 - Mini-Me yoga
 - 7 Sacred Teachings

Targeted strategies: small-group interventions to support student mental health:

- Example SAC group sessions
 - o Lego Therapy: focus on social skill development
 - o Girls Group (anxiety / Social Skills / Grief and Loss)
 - o Rainbows: grief and loss
 - o Art Therapy: trauma; grief/loss
- Defining, identifying and building developmental relationships
 - o <u>Building Developmental Relationships</u> session
 - o start with grade 3's; in the spring welcome in some grade 2's
 - o intentional mentorship by Aurora Leadership students
 - o running recess activities, student mentorship, school celebrations, school tours to new families, etc

Individualized strategies: one-to-one interventions to support student mental health:

Vera certified staff will meet for a second meeting each month. The goal of this meeting will be to address the numeracy goals as outlined in this document.

At times, admin will need to use some of the PD time for emergent needs. We also have a significant number of students on the spectrum and may need time to support our staff with PD around Autism.
